Biographical Sketch

Rev. Dr. N. Scott Cupp is a native New Yorker, who grew up in Williamson (outside of Rochester) and went to School in Canton and then Denver, Louisville, and Chicago. He received his Doctorate, from McCormick Seminary, in Congregational Transformation.

Scott had been Head of Staff of four churches. His first church was in a suburb of Youngstown, OH, and then in Nashville, TN, and then in suburban Philadelphia. He served the Synod of the NE as an Associate for Church Development. After leaving the Synod he served as an Interim Pastor in Howlett Hill, Rochester, and Seneca Falls. In 2011 he went to New Jersey to serve as an Interim Pastor and ended up serving as the Head of Staff there until he retired.

He is known in the Syracuse area for his involvement in cooperative ministries with Robinson, Taunton, and Howlett Hill. Since returning to Syracuse in retirement he has served as a guest Worship Leader for numerous churches throughout the Presbytery of Cayuga-Syracuse and Susquehanna Valley.

Scott recently published a book entitled "Come and See for Yourself – The Gospel as If for the First Time." It is a retelling of the gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke into a continuous story.

He has been married to his wife Tonia for 42 years. They have three grown children – Matthew, Nicholas, and Cassandra. Scott and Tonia live in Manlius along with a cat and a dog.


