

Towards the Ascension

By the time this goes to print, we will have journeyed along with Jesus Christ through all of Holy Week. From his triumphant yet humble arrival in Jerusalem, through his betrayal, denial, arrest, desertion, torture, crucifixion and finally - His Resurrection! We saw him break bread with his disciples and were reminded that every time we take part in the Lord's Supper, we do so in *Remembrance of Him*.

We were also given the command on Maundy Thursday to love one another as he loves us. (The word maundy comes from the Latin word "mandatum" which means "command." The actual command was "A new commandment I give to

you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another" (John 13:34).

This Maundy Thursday Commandment is not just to love the people we find lovable. Or to love people who are without sin (none of us is). Jesus teaches us to love even our enemies. Jesus teaches us to forgive and to tread where others fear to tread, sometimes especially where others fear to tread. To love as Jesus loves is to do so even when we find it otherwise impossible (which is why we need his help).

The story of Easter has an amazing sequel (or a continuation - Easter is a season, not just a day - encompassing the Ascension and continuing to Pentecost). Now, it's possible that the Apostle's Creed can throw a person off when it says, "On the third day he rose again from the dead and sitteth on the right hand of God, the Father Almighty ..." because it sounds as though Jesus rises and heads straight to heaven. But he doesn't, does he?

Jesus spends time with his disciples after his resurrection, in fact he spends another forty days (some of which is spent convincing them he has, in fact, risen). And those forty days are something we can think about as we head towards the day of Ascension on May 9th (See Luke 24:50-53 and Acts 1:1-11; see also Mark 16:19-20.)

Much like the disciples, some followers need convincing that Christ did indeed rise from the dead. Some of the disciples actually walked down the road (to Emmaus) with Jesus at their side and did not even recognize that it was him. (Clearly Jesus had a little fun with that, see Luke 24:13-35.). In this Easter season, we can focus on recognizing that Christ is always by our side, even when we might not know it.

For those of you who are fond of "The Chosen" series, there is a movie called, "Risen" (
https://www.imdb.com/title/tt3231054/) which is very much in the same vein. It is a movie about Jesus after his resurrection, as seen through the eyes of a Roman military Tribune, who believes in Roman Gods, not Jesus of Nazareth. But his life takes a turn, as evidenced by his line, "I have seen two things which cannot reconcile: A man dead without question, and that same man alive again. I pursue Him, the Nazarene, to ferret the truth."

Ours is to share that truth.

Stand firm then, with the belt of truth buckled around your waist, with the breastplate of righteousness in place and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of peace.

(Ephesians 6: 14-15)
