# Season of Advent

We are entering a season of expectation! As Christmas decorations begin to appear around town and children speak of what they want for Christmas, we sometimes experience expectations of the "perfect Christmas." We can get caught



up the frenzy of buying the right gifts and preparing the best meal. But the Season of Advent, which begins on December 3<sup>rd</sup> this year, reminds us that there was only one "perfect Christmas." That Christmas occurred over two thousand years ago, in the little town of Bethlehem.

Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ came to us as a vulnerable baby in a humble birthplace. There is no gift we can give one another that comes close to that perfect gift from God. We have been given the gift of salvation, the gift of everlasting love and forgiveness. A gift which is free to all who wish to unwrap it and accept it openly.

As we enter the Season of Advent we anticipate not only the birth of the baby Jesus, but we also await the second time that Christ will come to this earth. As we prepare for Christmas, we should remind ourselves that we should also be in constant preparation for the day when Christ comes back to us - whenever that might be.

The word advent comes from the Latin word "adventus" which translates to "coming" or arrival" and the history of Advent goes back to the early centuries of our faith. Early celebrations included times for fasting, prayer and penance. Later Christians adopted the tradition of the Advent wreath which began in Germany in the 1500s. The candles in the wreath represent hope, love, joy and peace - all of which come to us through Christ. In modern times, Advent is a time for reflection, spiritual growth, repentance, and prayer. It is a time to contemplate what the promise and hope of salvation through Jesus means to us in our lives. It is a time to live out what a sign posted on Van Buren Road beckons for us to do - "Have an attitude of gratitude."

Most importantly, Advent is a time to prepare our hearts and minds to be in the presence of Jesus Christ. Keeping that as a focus can help us to keep the commercial frenzy at bay. Jesus truly is the reason for the season. Let us keep that first and foremost in our hearts and minds as we enter this most joyous time of the year!



## The Cpl. Kyle Schneider Freedom Food Pantry

My name is Joseph Warner, and I established the Cpl. Kyle Schneider Freedom Food Pantry because I wanted to make a difference in my community, and I saw the need to help out our local veterans. Due to unfortunate circumstances, VFW post 153 could no longer operate, and with that went the food pantry they had used to supply around 20 veteran families. I did not want these veterans to go without food, so I started talking with the people who worked at the VFW pantry, and asked if I could create a new food pantry to serve these veterans.

After a lot of talking and scheduling, and working alongside the Cpl. Kyle Schneider Foundation, we had relocated the old pantry into a new location, the First Presbyterian Church right here in Baldwinsville, and started the process of stocking the pantry so that we could operate. After a period of fundraising and working on the pantry, we were able to start deliveries in August of this year, and since then we have done a delivery once a month to the veterans. My main goal for establishing this food pantry was to serve the community and to make a difference, and after going on some of the delivery runs, I truly do feel like I am making a change in my community.
