Congratulations! We have begun the first step toward the second milestone in the journey through transition by engaging the challenging work of "The Narrative Mission Study Process." You have completed the informal small group conversations both here at the church and on Zoom and the report of the small group gatherings has been sent out or will be sent out through the email blast, handed out in worship, and posted on the website. The next leg of the journey is the One Day Retreat Saturday, February 12

from 9 am to 2 pm in the Christian Education Center's Fellowship Hall. This day long retreat is focused on congregational members answering the question, "Why do we exist?' using the congregation's story both historically and biblically to create an identity statement that will be appearing on the website, in the bulletin, mailings and in sermons as well as used as a tool for evaluating ministries-those current and new. This identity statement will also be on the congregation's Ministry Information Form (MIF) to tell candidates who you are as body of Christ here in Baldwinsville.

An interpretative history of the congregation and biblical narratives that speak to the congregation's life story has been sent out to all of you to read in preparation for the One Day Retreat. Included at the end of the document is the agenda for the One Day Retreat, so you will know what we will be doing together. Bagels, fruit and Danish as well as lunch will be served at the retreat. I look forward to seeing all of you at the retreat.

Once the retreat is complete, we will move quickly to the next steps which is assessing the needs of the community using observations made by members of the community and demographic analysis from MissionInsite. This will guide the conversations about planning for mission to the community, especially those ministries not able to be started or re-started because of the pandemic.

By March we will be completing the Pastoral Characteristics and Competency Questionnaire that will bring to fruition your vision for the new installed pastor and how this person will partner with the congregation to live into the congregation's new identity.

This will be followed by meeting with presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM) through our liaison to receive permission to move toward completing the Ministry Information Form and electing a Pastor Nominating Committee.

Then, the search for the new installed pastor will begin.

So as we enjoy what we have accomplished and look toward to what is next, I think it is time as the old hymn reminds us to, "Come and celebrate the journey!"

A Faithful Response

New York State's Child Victims Act (2019) has brought to light several cases of sexual abuse of children within our Presbytery as well as our sister Presbyteries. We've managed the legal end of things by hiring representation, locating insurance policies, and producing the appropriate files. What else might we do? What is a just and faithful response?

The Presbytery is providing a series of opportunities to assist congregations, including those not directly impacted by claims, in providing a faithful response to the issue of sexual abuse. Although this initial focus is in response to the sexual abuse of children, we acknowledge that sexual violence impacts everyone. The church cannot remain silent and must take action to confront this evil.
