From the Church Office: The History of Father's Day

The history of Mother's Day goes back to the 1860s, and Mother's Day was declared a national holiday in 1914. Then the celebration of moms paved the way for Father's Day. The history of Father's Day goes back to 1908, when a church in West Virginia held a sermon to honor 362 men who had been killed the previous year in a coal mining explosion. This was the country's first-ever event to strictly honor fathers, but it was just a one-and-done thing, at least in that community.

The following year, however, a woman named Sonora Smart Dodd started her quest to establish Father's Day as a national holiday. Dodd was one of six children raised by their single father, and she thought fathers should be honored in the same way as mothers.

After she had petitioned her local community and government for a year, Dodd's home state of Washington celebrated its first official Father's Day on June 19, 1910. Over the years, the celebration of Father's Day spread from state to state, and after a long fight, it was finally declared a national holiday in 1972, when President Richard Nixon signed it into law. Now, we celebrate



with funny Father's Day quotes, dad quotes, father-son quotes and even stepdad quotes for the bonus dad in our lives.

It took more than 60 years from the birth of the idea to Father's Day being recognized as a federal holiday, and a lot happened to threaten the parent-celebrating holidays during that time. In the 1920s and 1930s, there was a national movement to get rid of both Mother's and Father's Day and replace them with one "Parent's Day." Beyond that, some men did not even want a Father's Day to begin with. They saw it as a "Hallmark holiday," invented for the sole purpose of a commercial gimmick, and as many fathers were the sole breadwinners at the time, they did not particularly want their hard-earned cash spent on flowers and chocolates.

The Great Depression and World War II, however, helped boost the idea of Father's Day. Struggling retailers pushed the gift-giving holiday during the Depression, and during the war, Father's Day became a way to honor the many fathers serving overseas. By the time President

Nixon signed the proclamation making Father's Day a holiday, it was already a national institution.

<u>New Member</u> <u>Spotlight!</u>

Meet Tom Eckrote:

I was born in Philadelphia, PA and grew up in the city and its suburbs. My younger sister (she is a subscriber and faithful viewer of the worship livestream) and I were raised in the Presbyterian church. Both our parents were Sunday School teachers. I graduated from Penn State (I saw Dave Bing and Jim Boeheim play basketball) with a degree in Science - majoring in Chemistry and Biochemistry. After college I worked for Publicker Industries, a chemical manufacturer and alcoholic beverage distiller in the Philadelphia area. I worked in both divisions primarily as a supervisor in plant operations. During my 11 years there I studied chemical engineering at Drexel University at night, completing a 4-year program of engineering classes in 2 years.

My life in CNY began in 1979 when I was recruited to work for Miller Brewing at their Fulton brewery where I worked as a brewing supervisor until they closed the plant 1994. For several years during the 80's I was a member of this church. When the brewery closed, I was transferred to their brewery in Fort Worth Texas where I worked for 9 years as a work group/shift manager (more work, more hours, more responsibility with little more pay, authority or respect). In Texas We joined a United Methodist church and while there I was called to lead an adult Sunday School class and later extended length (9 mo.) bible studies. I took early retirement after my mother passed away and we moved back to CNY to be closer to family and my father, joining Christ Community UMC. Shortly after returning here, we divorced and I stayed at that church where I led a few more of the Disciple bible studies. I had an opportunity to go on a mission trip to Zimbabwe with members from several other local Methodist churches. Among other things it helped me to appreciate luxuries like electricity, potable water, paved roads and coffee; and that a life of crushing poverty does not need to be an obstacle to Christian faith. I met my 2nd wife indirectly as a result of this trip.

I started working part-time at Wegmans on route 31. I thought I would work there for a few years but they kept putting me on the next week's schedule so I had to keep working. Now after almost 16 years I will take another early retirement and will finish there in July. As covid restrictions were easing, a sudden and painful divorce prompted me to find a new church and I decided to return to my Presbyterian roots. I was welcomed warmly as soon as I entered the Sanctuary the first Sunday and after three or four weeks, I felt welcomed, accepted, included, at home, and part of something special. I knew then that this would be my church home and family. Last fall I was asked to join the board of Deacons. At first I declined feeling that it would be way out of my comfort zone. A few people who I greatly respect urged me to reconsider and so I thought God was calling me to leave my comfort zone - similar to my experience in Texas with Sunday school/Bible study. I said yes and now here I am!


