Eastertide

Greetings during this joyous Season of Easter! Resurrection Sunday has once again been celebrated with Easter flowers and the singing of Hallelujahs, but we're not finished yet - the Season of Easter continues on!

Eastertide lasts for fifty days. It begins on Easter Sunday and ends on the Day of Pentecost (which celebrates when the Holy Spirit descended on the disciples in the form of tongues of fire). The word Pentecost means "fiftieth day" in Greek.

The first forty days of Eastertide commemorate the time the risen Christ remained on earth, and the last ten are the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord. It is truly amazing to think about the period of time that Jesus remained on earth after he rose. I don't think I fully appreciated until later in life, that the Jesus in the Bible is not just the pre-crucifixion Jesus, but rather there are forty days before the Ascension in which people were able to share their lives with the risen Christ - in person!

The Bible tells us that Jesus appeared at least ten times over forty days after he arose from the dead. It is during these encounters that we see him living out the promises of both the Old and New Testaments.

Here are many of the recorded instances of Jesus meeting with people during those forty days:

- #1. Mary Magdalene: (Mk 16:9-11)(Jn 20:11-18)
- #2. Two people, one named Cleopas, on the way to Emmaus: (Mk 16:12-13)(Lk 24:13-35)
- #3. Peter: (Lk 24:34)(1 Cor 15:5)
- #4. The 10 disciples in the upper room (without Thomas): (Lk 24:36-49)(Jn 20:19-23)
- #5. The 11 disciples in the upper room (with Thomas): (Mk 16:14-18)(Jn 20:26-29)(1 Cor 15:5)
- #6. The 7 disciples while fishing in the Lake of Tiberias (Galilee): (Jn 21:1-23)
- #7. The 11 disciples on a mountain in Galilee: (Mt 28:16-20)

#8. The disciples before His ascension at the Mount of Olives: (Mk 16:19-20)(Lk 24:50-52)(Acts 1:3-11)

- #9. More than 500: (1 Cor 15:6)
- #10. James (Jesus' brother): (1 Cor 15:7)

These forty days are when people begin to "spread the word!" It is the beginning of the Christian Church! At the end of the forty days comes the Ascension. This is when Jesus goes up to be with the Father, and before the Holy Spirit comes down to be our advocate. Have a look at the Book of Acts (Acts 1: 6-11) to refresh your memories on the Ascension.

Then ten more days pass and we get to the Pentecost. We are told:

"On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty windstorm, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in other languages as the Holy Spirit gave them this ability." It is somewhat amusing that when the Apostles speak in tongues some witnesses in the crowd said, "They're just drunk, that's all!" (Acts 2: 1-14). I'm not sure that the defense that Peter responds with in Acts 2:15 is the best he could have come up with. However, he goes on to give a better defense when he reminds them of the prophecy of Joel.



For now, let's remember that even when the lilies and tulips have been removed from the sanctuary and we are singing fewer Hallelujahs, we are still in Eastertide. The promise of the Resurrection remains with each of us during the fifty days of Eastertide and beyond. Christ is risen, Christ is risen indeed!






As you are spring cleaning, think about the Rummage Sale on August 4 & 5. Donations will be
