## What in the World are We Doing?

I've been in Baldwinsville long enough now that the odds are getting pretty good that if I go to a local grocery store, I'll bump into someone from the congregation (or run into one of the other local faith leaders). Having grown up in the small town of East Moriches, NY, this is familiar territory. When I'm back there, people will still come up to me, many years since I moved away from "Emo" and say, "You're Reverend Dickson's daughter." And if something eventful happens to someone from my hometown, I'll no doubt hear about it. People in communities tend to know what other folks are up to, and in many ways that is a good thing. So, what goes on with the greater community of Presbyterians in this world? What are we doing in the world?

One way to learn more about Presbyterian global activities is to visit the PCUSA website. There you will learn about the work that our denomination does in partnership with others throughout the world. There they state, "We believe that doing mission in partnership broadens our awareness of how interconnectional God's mission is at the local, national, and global levels. The one table around which we gather is God's table and the one mission to which we are called is God's mission." They go on to say, "Together with our global partners, PC(USA) mission co-workers engage in life-transforming ministries in 80 countries and help us understand issues of ministry across the world. Despair, poverty, and violence are being overcome in the name of Jesus Christ." (You can read more about our global partnerships here: https://www.presbyterianmission.org/ministries/world-mission/)

The site also offers prayer cards for missionaries. One such card talks about David and Sue Hudson who were "invited by the United Church of Christ in Japan (UCCJ) as liaisons for Japan Mission and Yodogawa Christian Hospital in mission partnership with the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. Yodogawa Christian Hospital was established by Japan Mission in a disadvantaged area of Osaka in 1955 with seed money provided by Presbyterian Women in the U.S. ... Over the years it has grown to become one of the larger hospitals in the region and a pioneer in providing healing of the whole person in the name of Jesus Christ. It also has the largest chaplaincy program of any hospital in Japan and is a pioneer in the hospice movement and medical innovation." (See prayer cards here:
